The children of the Greek school, Primary, High School and Lyceum, then presented a programme of Greek dancing taught to them by their teachers Xanthe Sotiropoulou and the Nursery School teacher Despina Andreadou and the Principal Mrs. Sophia Paxivanis; they ended by singing songs from Crete, His Beatitude's birthplace.
