It is with the greatest sorrow that we categorically express our unreserved support and our most intense abhorrence for the unacceptable and provocative actions of the illegal occupying forces of northern Cyprus in arresting and placing under detention His Grace Porphyrios Bishop of Neapolis and the members of the European Parliament together with their colleagues, during their visit to the Holy Church of Agia Zoni, which is in tormented Ammohostos, on 12th March 2011.

The above action comprises a flagrant violation of human rights, which are specified in the Constitution of the United Nations Organisation, as well as an outright offence against the highest Ecclesiastical Office of a country — member of the European Union and its official guests.
