## PALM SUNDAY AT THE PATRIARCHATE OF ALEXANDRIA

"My blessed children, these days you will hear from many people theological words, with philosophical meanings around the great event of the Resurrection of our Lord. But at this moment, I want to speak to you from the surplus of my heart and I say to you: Celebrate a real and genuine Pascha this year as well! Let neither the pandemic, nor the evil of the world, nor the individualism that tends to alter our humanity hinder us".

"We persist and strive to celebrate Pascha, as a passage from despair to hope, from difficulty to freedom and light, next to the blessed people of the Lord."

In conclusion, the Alexandrian Primate expressed his expressed

his support for Egypt for the problem it faces on the issue of the Nile River, stressing that: "The waters of the Nile are a sacred river that quenches the thirst of all countries and no country has the right to deprive another country of its water".

Following the end of the Patriarchal Divine Liturgy, in the courtyard of the Monastery, the festival market held annually on the same day by the Lyceum of Greek Ladies of Alexandria took place, for the assistance of suffering residents.
